

Grand Junction, Colorado, September 6, 1913.

All the Commissioners having been duly notified, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in special session at 10 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg.

The labor account of the Department of Highways for work done on Sidewalk District No. 1, amounting to \$122.80, having been approved by the Commissioner of Highways and audited, it was moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the same be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the labor account allowed.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council adjourned.
