Grand Junction, Colorado, September 23, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Todd, Vorbeck, Rankin, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Vedder.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of September 16th were read and approved. A committee of the directors of the Mesa County Fair Association, composed of Messrs. Dudley, Hunter and Price, appeared before the Council and asked that the proposition to puchase the Fair Grounds by the city at the price of \$30,000, the Fair Association to be allowed the free use of the grounds for two years (after that time the matter of free use to be at the discretion of the city council), be submitted to a vote of the people at the next general city election.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the petition of the Mesa County Fair Association be granted, and that the City Attorney be instructed to prepare the necessary papers and resolution to submit the matter to a vote of the people at the next general city election.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vorbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having veted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

A communication from Fred E. Morrell, acting U. S. District Forester, in reference to the preliminary power permit recently granted the city, was read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Communication was referred to the Mayor.

The bill of A. L. Antles for \$37.50, for one-half expenses to Omaha and Lincoln, Neb., having been approved by the Comissioner of Public Affairs, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the same be allowed and warrant ordered drawn on the Advertising fund for the amount.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Todd, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yes, the motion was declared carried, and the bill allowed.

On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
