

Grand Junction, Colorado, October 7, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Rankin, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of September 30 and adjourned session of October 1 were read and approved.

Mrs. C. B. Rich and other ladies, representing the Cemetary Improvement Association, appeared before the Council, and asked that the proposition of the purchase by the city of the Orchard Mesa and Fairview cemeteries be submitted to a vote of the people at the next municipal election.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that a committee be appointed by the Mayor to look into the matter of the purchase of the cemeteries and report to the Council at its next meeting.

The motion carried, and the Mayor appointed as said committee: Commissioners Vedder, Verbeck and Rankin.

A committee from the local organization of stationary engineers appeared before the Council and asked that an ordinance be drawn and passed, requiring the examination of engineers in this city before permitted to operate engines.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the matter of requiring the examination of stationary engineers be taken under advisement and made the special order of business at the next regular meeting of the Council.

The motion carried.

A communication from Ben Safley in reference to the payment or not of the \$22,000 issue of water bonds maturing next year was read, and on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the communication was ordered placed on file.

The reports of the Chief of the Fire Department and the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same were, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The report of the City Treasurer for the third quarter of the current fiscal year was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the report was referred to the auditor.
