The committee appointed to investigate the matter of submitting the proposition at the next general election of the purchase by the city of the Orchard Mesa and Fairview commeteries submitted the following report:

To the Honorable Mayor and City Council:

We, your committees appointed for the purpose of investigating and considering the feasibility of the purchase by the city of Orchard Mesa and Fairview cemeteries, beg leave to report as fellows:

We find that the lewest price that the city could buy these preperties for is \$10,000.00, which is entirely out of proportion and above the market value of similar lands in this vicinity.

We find that at least a pertien of these cemeteries are in the Orchard Mesa Irrigation District, which would entail the payment annually of heavy assessment for water, which would not be needed in such cemeteries.

It is our further epinion that the conditions existing in the Orchard Mesa cemetery renders it well near impossible to develop a really beautiful and attractive burial place, such as Grand Junction Municipal Cemetery should and could be made.

We therefore recommend that no action be taken by the City Council toward the purchase of this cemetery property from Mr. Bannister.
