

Grand Junction, Colorado, October 21, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Todd in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners Responded as present: Todd, Vedder, Verbeck, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Rankin.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of October 14th and special meeting of October 20th were read and approved.

Mr. J. H. Smith appeared before the Council and asked that he be granted a license for expressman for the balance of the current fiscal year at one-half the semi-annual rate.

Moved by Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that J. H. Smith be granted an expressman's license for the balance of the current fiscal year, upon the payment of \$3.75 to the city treasurer.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners present.

A communication from Dr. E. F. Eldridge in reference to the practice of citizens to rake up fallen leaves and try to burn them before dry, and recommending that such leaves be left on the ground over winter, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the communication was received and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly reports of the Commissioner of Public Affairs, Commissioner of Water and Sewers, and the City Treasurer having been examined and approved by the auditor, the said reports were, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, accepted and ordered placed on file.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Vedder, the same was referred to the auditor.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

WHEREAS, it appears to the Council that Warrant No. ¹³⁴⁷⁶~~14,476~~ issued ^{November 30,} ~~December~~ 1912, to Henry Hale for janitor services for the month of November, 1912, has been lost or destroyed; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Mayor and City Clerk be authorized to issue in lieu thereof a warrant for \$20.00, payable to Henry Hale for services as janitor for the month of ^{#16271} November, 1912.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Todd, yea; Vedder, yea; Verbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Vedder, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned until Thursday, October 23, at 10 o'clock a. m.
