

Grand Junction, Colorado, November 18, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carsen, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of November 11th and adjourned session of November 14th were read and approved.

Peter La Fever having made application for a renewal of license for pool and billiard parlor, it was moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that a pool and billiard license be granted to Mr. LaFever, provided, that upon investigation by the police department it is found that no objectionable features are connected with his place.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

A communication from the Denver & Rio Grande -Railroad Company, submitting an agreement covering roadway crossing on Thirteenth street, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, that the following resolution be passed and adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED, That the contract covering use of right of way for wagon road crossing over the track and roadbed of The Rio Grande Junction Railway Company, in form as just read and attached thereto, be entered into by the City of Grand Junction, and the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute said agreement on behalf of the City, and the Clerk is hereby authorized to attest the same and affix the seal of the City thereto.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carsen, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the Mayor and City Attorney be instructed to prepare a resolution in reference to the matter of asking an additional appropriation of \$100,000 from Congress for the Grand Junction Postoffice Building, the said resolution to be addressed to U. S. Senator Shafreth.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council.

Commissioner Rankin made a verbal report in the matter of the condition of the Sawyer building and premises, referred to him and ex-Mayor Todd, and recommended that the City repair the walk to rear of lots, <sup>P</sup>replace the water hydrant, and rewire the building for electric lights.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the report of Commissioner Rankin be accepted, and that the repairs recommended in the report be made by the City, provided Mr. Sawyer will accept the same in full settlement of his claim. The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the Council adjourned.
