Meved by Cemmissioner Helmburg, seconded by Cemmissioner Verbeck, that the report of Cemmissioner Rankin be accepted, and that the repairs recommended in the report be made by the City, provided Mr. Sawyer will accept the same in full settlement of his claim. The metion being put, upon call of roll, the Cemmissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the Council adjourned.
