

Grand Junction, Colorado, November 22, 1913.

All the Commissioners having been duly notified, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in special session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

The depository bond of the Mesa County National Bank, in the amount of eight thousand (\$8,00.00) dollars, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the said bond be accepted and ordered placed on file.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bond accepted.

John H. Newman having made application for permit to erect a one-story brick building on Lot 10, in Block 122, in the City of Grand Junction, it was moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Mayor and Clerk be authorized to issue a building permit to the said John H. Newman for one-story brick building on said lot.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council, and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the Council adjourned.
