

Grand Junction, Colorado, November 25, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carsen, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of November 15th and special meeting of November 22d were read and approved.

Communications were received and read from the following persons:

E. A. and J. E. Ryan, offering for sale Lots 15 and 16, in Block 123, for new Fire Station and quoting a price thereon.

A. O. Shaff, submitting a bid for one and two years for collecting the garbage of the city.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, the communications were ordered placed on file.

The City Clerk submitted to the Council a list of registered electors appearing not to have voted at the General Municipal Election held November 4th, 1913, in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the list submitted by the Clerk be accepted by the Council; and that notices be sent to all persons whose names appear on said list in accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 212, and that December 5, 15 and 22 be designated as the dates for the sittings of the committee of the City Council for the purpose of hearing reasons why the names of such non-voting electors should be retained on the registration lists.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned until Friday, November 25th, at 4 o'clock p. m.
