

Grand Junction, Colorado, November 28, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Carsen.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The following bills having been approved by heads of departments and audited, were read by the Clerk:

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "The Annual Appropriation Ordinance of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, Providing for the Expenses and Liabilities of the City of Grand Junction for the Fiscal Year Beginning January First, A. D. 1914, and Ending December 31, A. D. 1914," was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the proof of publication as read be accepted and ordered placed on file.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the proposed ordinance was then taken up for final passage, and read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that paragraph nine, of Section 1, of the proposed ordinance be amended so as to read as follows:

"Ninth: For salaries of city officers and employes, \$9,100.00."

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the amendment passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the proposed ordinance as read and amended, and entitled "The Annual Appropriation Ordinance of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, Providing for the Expenses and Liabilities of the City of Grand Junction for the Fiscal Year Beginning January First, A. D. 1914, and Ending December 31, A. D. 1914," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 215.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Approving the Whole Cost of the Improvements in and for Paving District No. 2, in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, Pursuant to Ordinance No. 175, adopted and approved June 11, 1910, and Pursuant to Resolutions and Proceedings of the City Council adopted pursuant to said Ordinance, Approving the Apportionment of said Cost to each Lot or Tract of Land or other Real Estate in said District, Assessing the Share of said Cost against each Lot or Tract of Land or other Real Estate in said District, and Prescribing the

Manner for the Collection and Payment of said Assessments, " was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proof of publication as read be accepted and ordered placed on file.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried, and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the proposed ordinance as read, and entitled "An Ordinance Approving the Whole Cost of Improvements in and for Paving District No. 2, in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, Pursuant to Ordinance No. 175, adopted and approved June 11, 1910, and pursuant to Resolutions and Proceedings of the City Council adopted pursuant to said ordinance, Approving the Apportionment of said Cost to each Lot or Tract of Land or other Real Estate in said District, Assessing the Share of said Cost against each Lot or Tract of Land or other Real Estate in said District, and Prescribing the Manner for the Collection and Payment of said Assessments," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 216.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

The official bond of Henry Tupper, as City Attorney, having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, it was moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the bond be accepted and ordered placed on file.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

WHEREAS, the Mesa County National Bank has closed its doors and suspended payment; and

WHEREAS, the deposits of the City in said bank, amounting to \$5,236.04, are covered by a depository bond of \$5,000.00, given by the Equitable Surety Co. as surety; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be and hereby is instructed to notify the said Equitable Surety Co. of St. Louis, Mo., of said facts, said notice to be in accordance with the terms of said bond.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea; the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council then adjourned.
