Moved by Com. Carson and seconded by Com. Rankin that bills as read be allowed and Warrants drawn for the various amounts.

On call of roll each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Cherrington yea, Verbeck yea, Carson yea, Rankin yea.--All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed. I

It was moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson that Com. Rankin act as Clerk Pro. Tem. during the absence of Commissioner Holmburg during his sickness. Motion was unanimously carried, and Com. Rankin was declared to be elected as Clerk Pro. Tem.

Mayor Cherrington placed in nomination C.H. Wallis for the position of police. Moved by Com. Verbeck seconded by Com. Carson that the nomination of C.H. Wallis as Chief of Police be confirmed. Upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington yea, Verbeck yea, Carson yea, Rankin yea. All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and C.H. Wallis appointed as Chief of Police.

Committee on Federal building recommended that a letter be drafted to be signed by all the Commissioners, and forwarded to Senator Shaffroth, urging him to use his best efforts for the passage of the pending bill for an additional appropriation of \$50000.00 and asking him to also turn over for Federal building \$50000.00 of his apportionment out of the Sundry Civil Bill. Recommendation was adopted and a letter according to recommendation ordered drafted.

On motion of Com. Verbeck seconded by Com. Carson Council adjourned
