

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 9th, 1913.

A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Grand Junction was held this day at 4 o'clock p. m., with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Vorbeck, Rankin, Carson. Absent: Commissioner Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved.

A communication from the Forest Supervisor at Collbran, relating to right-of-way for water pipe line and dam at Kannah Creek intake, was read, and on motion of Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the communication was referred to the City Attorney.

Commissioner Vorbeck introduced the following resolution:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, T. F. Flucken has filed an objection to amount charged to him under Sidewalk District No. 1; and

WHEREAS, the said Flucken is not present; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the matter of the consideration of the said objection and acceptance and confirmation of the apportionment be postponed until

Wednesday, December 10th, at 4 o'clock p. m., and the said Flucken be notified to be present, if he so desires.

Moved by Commissioner Vorbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the resolution as read be adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Com. Vorbeck that the following resolution be passed and adopted: Whereas, the building at 725' Road ave, in the city of Grand Junction, because of natural decay and other causes, has become unsafe and dangerous to individuals passing said building on the street and to the persons residing therein, and whereas, the said building is located within the fire limits; therefore, be it Resolved, that the said building is hereby found and declared to be unsafe to passers by and to the people residing therein, and the Marshal of the City is hereby ordered to notify the owner of the building, or his agent, to repair the said building, or to tear the said building down within 48 hours after receipt of such notice.
