

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 16, 1913.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of December 9th, and adjourned sessions of December 10th and 12th, were read and approved as corrected, the minute of December 12th in reference to the introduction and passage of an emergency ordinance providing for a special appropriation for the maintenance of the city water works being ordered stricken from the record.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, under the terms and provisions of Ordinance No. 178, the City Council has created Paving District No. 3 of the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, and the said City Council has caused to be published, as required by said ordinance, a notice of the completion of said district and apportionment of the costs thereof, and

WHEREAS, no written objections or any other objection have been

filed with the Clerk with respect to the proposed assessment of costs of said improvements, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, That the time under said ordinance for filing objections of any kind against the acceptance of said work and the assessment therefor, has now expired, and the said improvement is hereby confirmed, all in pursuance of said ordinance.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Approving the Whole Cost of Improvements made in and for Paving District Number 3 in the City of Grand Junction, Colorado, Pursuant to Ordinance Number 175, adopted and approved June 11, 1910, and

Pursuant to Resolutions and Proceedings of the City Council adopted pursuant to said Ordinance, approving the Apportionment of said Costs to each Lot or Tract of Land or other Real Estate in said District, Assessing the Share of said Cost against each Lot or Tract of Land or Other Real Estate in said District, and Prescribing the Manner for the Collection and Payment of said Assessments," was introduced and read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Providing for an Emergency Appropriation for the City Water Works," was introduced by Commissioner Carson and read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted as an emergency ordinance by a unanimous vote of the Council.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 217, and that the same be ordered published in the Daily Sentinel, the official newspaper of the city.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council, and it was so ordered.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that whereas it has been the custom of the city for a number of years to pay the salaries for the month of December of regular city employes before Christmas, the Mayor and Clerk be authorized and instructed to issue the warrants in payment of the December salaries of all regular city employes on or immediately after December 20, 1913.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the Council adjourn.

The motion carried, and the Council then adjourned.
