The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four e'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The minutes of the regular meeting of December 16th and special meeting of December 20th were read and approved.

A communication from A. N. Anderson, submitting a bid for garbage collection, was presented and read.

The efficial bend of Chas. H. Wallis, Chief of Police, having been examined and approved by the City Atterney, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The depository bond of the United States Bank and Trust Co. having been examined and approved by the City Atterney, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways and the report of the Judge of the Municipal Court from October 1 to November 11, having been examined and approved by the auditor, the reports were, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the building at 620 Main Street in the City of Grand Junction, because of natural decay and other causes has become unsafe and dangerous to individuals passing said building on the street and to the persons residing therein, and

WHEREAS, the said building is located within the fire limits, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the said building is hereby found and declared to be unsafe to passers-by and to the people residing therein, and the Marshal of the City is hereby ordered to notify the owner of the building or his agent to repair the said building or to tear the said building down within 48 hours after receipt of such notice.

Meved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The metion being put, upon call of rell, the Commissioners veted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayer declared the metion carried, and the resolution passed and adopted.

On metien of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council adjourned to Friday, December 26, at 4 e'clock p. m.
