

Grand Junction, Colorado, January 6, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of December 30th and adjourned session of December 31st were read and approved.

Mayer Cherrington reported favorably on the petition for an arc light at Ninth street and Colorado avenue, and recommended that a light be ordered placed at said point.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the report of the Mayor be accepted and that an arc light be ordered placed at the intersection of Ninth street and Colorado avenue.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and it was so ordered.

The quarterly report of the City Weigher for the month of December was presented and read, and on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the same was referred to the Mayor.

The quarterly reports of the City Treasurer, Judge of the Municipal Court, and Commissioner of Highways were submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the reports were referred to the auditor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the report was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

Communications were presented and read from H. E. Mulnix and John H. Baker, certified public accountants, in reference to the auditing of the city's books and accounts.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the communications were ordered placed on file.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The official bond of William C. Hermann, night police, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, accepted and ordered placed on file.

A communication from the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty in reference to the matter of garbage collection was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the communication was ordered placed on file.

On the question as to who are salaried city employes, the City Attorney rendered a verbal opinion, holding that, under the provisions of the Charter, only those whose salary is provided by ordinance are regular salaried employes and subject to civil service rules.

The quarterly report of the City Health Officer was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the Council adjourned.
