

Grand Junction, Colorado, January 20, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 13 were read and approved.

A petition from A. C. Foster and others in reference to water main and arc light on North avenue, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the petition was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The annual report of the Board of Directors of the Public Library, including the report of the Librarian, was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was referred to the auditor.

The annual report of the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the report was referred to the auditor.

The annual report of the City Clerk and Auditor was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the report was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried,

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the Council adjourned.
