

Grand Junction, Colorado, January 27, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 20th were read and approved.

The petition of the Ross Hardware and Supply Co., asking for a license to carry on the business of plumbing, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the petition was granted and a license ordered issued.

The quarterly reports of the Commissioner of Public Affairs, the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, the Commissioner of Highways, and the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty having been examined and approved by the Auditor and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, the said reports were, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, accepted and ordered placed on file.

A communication from Local Union No. 244 of the Brotherhood of Carpenters and Joiners, asking the Commissioners to be present at a meeting of the Union to be held January 29th, was read and ordered placed on file.
