The bends of J. E. McKenzie and Abe Goodman having been examined and approved by the City Atterney, it was moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the petitions of the said J. E. McKenzie and Abe Goodman be granted and the license be ordered issued.
