

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 3, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of January 27th and adjourned session of January 30th were read and approved.

The petition of Joseph Peirier and others, asking the Council to order a cement sidewalk constructed along the south side of Blocks 34 and 35 in the city of Grand Junction, was submitted and read.

The Commissioner of Highways having reported favorably on the petition just read, the following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, Joseph Peirier and others have petitioned for a cement sidewalk to be constructed along the south side of Blocks 34 and 35, and, whereas, said sidewalk is necessary; therefore be it

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Grand Junction that the said petition be granted, and that a cement sidewalk be and hereby is ordered constructed as follows: Along the south side of Blocks 34 and 35 in the City of Grand Junction; and

RESOLVED, that the City Clerk be and hereby is authorized and instructed to notify the owners of the property above described to construct a cement sidewalk in front of their respective premises within 60 days after the receipt of said notice.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution adopted.

The petitions of J. E. McKenzie and Abe Goodman, asking for a renewal of plumbers' license, were presented and read.

The bonds of J. E. McKenzie and Abe Goodman having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, it was moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the petitions of the said J. E. McKenzie and Abe Goodman be granted and the license be ordered issued.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

The report of the City Weigher for the month of January was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the same was referred to the Mayor.

The renewal of the depository bond of the Grand Valley National Bank having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the said bond was, on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, accepted and ordered placed on file.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Relating to and Providing for the Government, Management and Protection of the Public Parks of the City of Grand Junction, and for the Buildings, Trees, Shrubs, and other Improvements within said Parks, and to Provide Penalties for Injuring or Destroying the Same," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carsen, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Water Works," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Carsen, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carsen, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, the Council adjourned until Friday, February 6, at 4 o'clock p. m.
