

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 6, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular adjourned session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Creating a Board of City Forestry and Providing for the Regulation of Planting, Preservation and Care of Trees in the Streets, Avenues and Public Highways of the City of Grand Junction," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the Council adjourned.
