

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 17, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carsen, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 10th were read and approved.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, that the Clerk be instructed to advertise in the two daily newspapers for bids for the construction of the new Fire House and Jail, bids to be opened by the Council at 4 o'clock p. m., on Tuesday, March 3d, bids to be made for ~~construction of~~ the complete construction of building or for the several units thereof.

The motion carried.

Application was made by M. F. Dike for the erection of an illuminated sign in front of the Masonic hall on Fourth street.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, the application was referred to the Mayor and Clerk, with power to act.

Peter Olsen petitioned the Council for permission to move portable lunch counter from the corner of Pitkin avenue and Second street to the corner of Main and Third streets. On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the petition was referred to the Mayor.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Carsen, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carsen, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Relating to and Providing for the Government, Management and Protection of the Public Parks of the City of Grand Junction, and for the Buildings, Trees, Shrubs, and other Improvements within said Parks, and to Provide Penalties for Injuring or Destroying the Same," was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the proof of publication of said proposed ordinance was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, that the proposed ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Relating to and Providing for the Government, Management and Protection of the Public Parks of the City of Grand Junction, and for the Buildings, Trees, Shrubs, and other Improvements within said Parks, and to Provide Penalties for Injuring or Destroying the Same," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carsen, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 221.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Creating a Board of City Forestry and Providing for the Regulation of Planting, Preservation and Care of Trees in the Streets, Avenues and Public Highways of the City of Grand Junction," was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the proof of publication of the proposed ordinance as read be accepted and ordered placed on file.

The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the proposed ordinance be laid on the table until next regular meeting of the Council.

The motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, the Council adjourned.
