A preposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Repealing Section Four of Ordinance Number 165, passed and adopted September 25th, 1909," was introduced and read.

Meved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The metion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having veted yea, the Mayer declared the metion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Water Works," was introduced by Commissioner Carson and read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The metien being put, each Commissioner as his name was called , veted as fellows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, no; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, no.

A majerity of the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayer declared the metion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

The bill of Ona Mergan for \$115.00, for one herse, having been approved by the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, it was moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg that the bill be allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on the Water fund for the amount.

The metien being put, upon call of rell, the Commissioners veted as fellows: Cherrington; yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the metion carried and the bill allowed.

On metion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the proposed ordinance was taken up, read and considered by section.

When section 13 had been reached, the Council, on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, adjourned until to-morrow, February 25, at ten e'clock a. m.
