

Grand Junction, Colorado, February 24, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at 4 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 17th were read and approved.

Lerin B. Staley appeared before the Council in reference to the petition of Peter Olsen for permission to move a certain lunch car to the corner of Third and Main streets, and asked that said petition be granted.

Mayer Cherrington, to whom said petition had been referred, reported adversely to granting same.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the report of the Mayer be accepted and the petition not granted.

The motion carried.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Repealing Section Four of Ordinance Number 168, passed and adopted September 25th, 1909," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayer declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Water Works," was introduced by Commissioner Carson and read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, no; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, no.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayer declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

The bill of Ona Mergan for \$115.00, for one horse, having been approved by the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, it was moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg that the bill be allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on the Water fund for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayer declared the motion carried and the bill allowed.

Under the head of unfinished business, the Council took up for consideration a proposed ordinance, laid on the table at the previous meeting, providing for the creation of a board of forestry and regulating the planting and care of street trees.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, the proposed ordinance was taken up, read and considered by section.

When section 13 had been reached, the Council, on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, adjourned until to-morrow, February 25, at ten o'clock a. m.
