

Grand Junction, Colorado, March 3, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carsen, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of February 24th and adjourned session of February 25th were read and approved.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, that the Council proceed to open the several bids for the construction of the new Fire House and City Jail. The Motion carried, and the following bids were opened and read:

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The bond of Jehn Fuite as master plumber having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, accepted and ordered filed, and a renewal of plumbers' license to said Fuite granted.

The official bond of Carl W. Plumb, City Health Officer, having been examined and approved by the City Attorney, the same was on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, accepted and ordered placed on file.

Revs. Shattuck and Moses, representing the Church Federation of Grand Junction, appeared before the Council and submitted a proposed ordinance licensing and regulating public dance halls, and asked the Council to consider and pass the same.

It was agreed to take the matter under advisement.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, the Council adjourned until to-morrow, March 4th, at 9 o'clock a. m.
