All the Cemmissioners having veted yea, the Mayor declared the metion carried.

Meved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the bid of the Mayer Paint Co. for painting building be accepted, on condition that bids for other units be reduced sufficiently to permit the erection of the building complete with the funds available for same.

The metion being put, upon call of roll, the Co missioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbook, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea. All the Commissioners having veted yea, the Mayer declared the metion carried.

Meved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the bid of The Corson Electric Co. for the electric wiring be accepted, on condition that bids for other units be reduced sufficiently to permit the erection of the building complete with the funds available for same.

The metien being put, upon call of rell the Commissioners veted as fellows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having veted yea, the Mayer declared the metien carried.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson that the bid of M. F.

Dike and T. J. Clark for the sheet metal work at \$200.00, and the Genasce asphalt reefing,

for \$175.00, be accepted, on condition that bids for other units be reduced sufficiently

to permit the erection of the building complete with the funds available for same.

The metion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having veted yea, the Mayer declared the metien carried.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that all the remaing bids be rejected, and that the architect be instructed to prepare new plans and specifications for the units for which bids have not been accepted.

The metien carried.
