

Grand Junction, Colorado, March 14, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened, pursuant to adjournment, at 11 o'clock a. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the revised bid of W. C. Beyer for complete construction of building, except these parts or units already let, for \$5,567.00, be accepted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the Council adjourned.
