

Grand Junction, Colorado, April 21, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 14 were read and approved.

The petition of C. A. Emery and others, asking that an arc light be placed at the intersection of Second street and Hill avenue, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the petition was referred to the Mayor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the auditor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the report was referred to the auditor.

A communication from Charles D. Fawcett, Dept. of Elect. Engineering, University of Pennsylvania, was presented and read, and on motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the communication was referred to the Mayor.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The Council now took up the consideration of the bids for the collection and disposal of the city garbage submitted and opened at the previous meeting, the unsigned bid of \$45.00 having since been signed by A. O. Shaff.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the bid of A. O. Shaff be accepted, and that a contract be entered into between the City and the said A. O. Shaff for the period from May 1st, 1914, to November 1, 1915, for the collection and disposal of garbage according to specifications and requirements of the city ordinances; the said Shaff to be required to furnish a bond for \$1,000.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, no.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried. Bids for the construction of cement sidewalk on three sides of Block 84 were submitted and read, the same being as follows:

H. A. Pelker, bid 8 and 7-8 cents per square feet.
 Geo. F. Toupain & Fix, bid 9 and 3-4 cents per square feet.
 Edward Johnson, bid 9 and 1-5 cents per square feet.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the bid of H. A. Pelker be accepted and that a contract be entered into with the said Pelker for the construction of the sidewalk, it being understood that the County of Mesa shall pay one-half of the contract price, and that the Mayor and Clerk be instructed to execute the contract on behalf of the city.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
 Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the following resolution be passed and adopted:

WHEREAS, there remains in the city treasury a balance of \$174.27 in the Advertising Fund, and

WHEREAS, no appropriation has been made for the year 1914 on said fund; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the said sum be transferred to the General Fund, and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies is hereby authorized and instructed to make the necessary transfer.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
 Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the Council adjourned.
