

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 5, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of April 28th were read and approved.

The Commissioner of Highways reported that a verbal petition had been presented to him for a cement sidewalk along the east side of lots 7, 8 and 9 in Block 8 of Mobley's addition, and recommended that said sidewalk be ordered constructed.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the following resolution be passed and adopted:

WHEREAS, petition has been made for a cement sidewalk to be laid on the east side of lots 7, 8 and 9, Block 8, Mobley's Sub-division, and

WHEREAS, the Council deems the construction of said sidewalk is necessary; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that a cement sidewalk be and hereby is ordered constructed in accordance with the provisions of the city ordinance, 75 feet along South Spruce street, on the east side of lots 7, 8 and 9, Block 8, of Mobley's Sub-division, City of Grand Junction, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the City Clerk be and hereby is authorized and instructed to notify the owners of said lots to construct a cement sidewalk along the east side of said lots within thirty days after the receipt of said notice.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.
