

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 19, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present; Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carsen, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 12th were read and approved.

A communication from the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, submitting a list of delinquent water accounts, was presented and read. *Said report showed the following delinquencies: One delinquent 6 quarters; two, 3 quarters; thirty-two, 2 quarters, and 153 delinquent one quarter.*

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the communication was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Highways has recommended to the Council that cement sidewalks be ordered constructed in front of the lots hereafter described, and

WHEREAS, the Council deems that the construction of the sidewalks is necessary; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that cement sidewalks be and hereby are ordered constructed in accordance with the provisions of the city ordinance in front of the following described lots, namely:

Lots 1 to 12, Block 109, north side.

Lots 17, 18, 19, Block 108, south and east side.

Lots 19, 20, 21 and 22, Block 54, south side.

West side Block 6 and south side same, Meberly subdivision.

North 125 feet, north end of west side of Block 7, Meberly subdivision.

North side lot 5, Block 121.

North side lots 3 to 16 inclusive, Block 35.

South side Block 100; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the City Clerk be and hereby is authorized and instructed to notify the owners of the above described lots to construct cement sidewalks in front of said described lots within thirty days after receipt of said notice.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carsen, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Carsen, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council adjourned.
