

Grand Junction, Colorado, May 26, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 19th were read and approved.

Mr. Meerhead of the Daily Sentinel and Mr. Fuller of the Daily News appeared before the Council and asked the Commissioners to take formal action indorsing the efforts of the local daily press to encourage the consumption of home products.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Caretaker at the Kannah Creek Intake and the Foreman of Construction and Repair of the City Water and Sewer Systems, and Fixing the Salaries of Certain Employees," was presented and read, and on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the said proof of publication was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried, and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the proposed ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Caretaker at the Kannah Creek Intake and the Foreman of Construction and Repair of the City Water and Sewer Systems, and Fixing the Salaries of Certain Employees," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 225.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the Mayor, Commissioner of Highways and Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty be appointed a special committee to confer with Mr. Pelker, cement contractor, in reference to repairing the sidewalk on the north side of Maple Park.

The motion carried.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the Western Slope Manufacturers' Association in conjunction with the daily newspapers have launched a campaign for the increase in the consumption of home manufactured goods, and

WHEREAS, such a campaign has for its ultimate end the betterment of the commercial interests of the city and the broadening of its industrial sphere; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Commissioners of the City of Grand Junction hereby endorse the efforts of the Western Slope Manufacturers' Association and the daily newspapers in this campaign, and urge upon the residents of the city a complete response to the movement, to the end that our city may grow and develop along generous commercial lines.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

F. A. Rowland and M. J. Lambert having applied for expressman's licenses, it was moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that they be granted the licenses to the end of the current fiscal year for \$8.75 each.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the licenses granted.

On motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
