

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 2, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners upon call of roll responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carsen, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of May 26th were read and approved.

Mr. Wilson, proprietor of the Majestic Theatre, appeared before the Council and asked for permission to erect a temporary airdome at the corner of Sixth and Main streets to be operated during the reconstruction of the Majestic Theatre.

Moved by Commissioner Carsen, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the concession be granted Mr. Wilson on account of the reconstruction of the building now occupied by the Majestic Theatre, and that he be granted a permit to erect a temporary airdome on the corner of Sixth and Main streets, Mr. Wilson agreeing to pay any increased insurance to the adjoining property owners.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carsen, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the permit granted to Mr. Wilson.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the same was referred to the Mayor.

F. E. Welch having applied for a renewal of license as cement work contractor, it was moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, that the license be granted upon the filing of a satisfactory bond with the City Clerk.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

A communication from Smith Riley, District Forester, in reference to the co-operation of the U. S. Forest Service with the City in maintaining the best possible sanitary conditions upon the Kannah Creek water shed, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, the communication was ordered placed on file.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, it appears to the Council that the sidewalk on the east side of Block 6, Meberley's Sub-division of the city of Grand Junction, is in a dangerous condition and a new sidewalk is necessary; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the sidewalk along the east side of said block be condemned, and that a cement sidewalk be and hereby is ordered constructed along the east side of said Block 6, Meberley's Sub-division of the City of Grand Junction; and be it further

RESOLVED, that that the City Clerk be and hereby is authorized and

instructed to notify the owners of the lots fronting on the east side of said block to construct cement sidewalks in front of said described lots within thirty days after receipt of said notice.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeek, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the Board of Forestry be instructed to have all cotton-bearing cottonwood trees growing on City property and in the streets trimmed or removed.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea:

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

Mr. Ben Griffith and others appeared before the Council and submitted a petition signed by qualified electors and requesting that a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Purchasing, Acquiring, Condemning, Constructing, Improving, Maintaining, Owning and Operating Electric Light, Power and Gas Werks by the City of Grand Junction," be submitted to a vote of the people of the city, unless said proposed ordinance be passed without alteration by the Council, according to the provisions of the Charter.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the petition be referred to the City Clerk and City Attorney for examination in reference to the required number of signatures and that it be reported upon at the next meeting of the Council.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
