

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 23, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeek, Rankin, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Carson.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 16th and special meeting of June 20th were read and approved.

A communication from Griffith, Watson & Smith, attorney for Miss Edith Marsh, in reference to injury sustained by the said Miss Marsh on sidewalk on the north side of Main street and west of Second street, on May 9, 1914, was read.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeek, the communication was referred to the Mayor and the City Attorney.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeek, that the Mayor and Commissioner of Highways be appointed a committee to employ a competent architect or structural engineer to examine the building known as the Park Opera House, with the

understanding that the expense on the part of the City shall ^{be one-half of cost of such service, but} not exceed \$25.00.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Council order a cement sidewalk and curb constructed on the south side of Walnut Park, on Gunnison avenue, between Fourth and Fifth streets.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the sidewalk and curb ordered constructed.

The quarterly report of the Public Librarian was submitted and read.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was referred to the auditor.

The bill of R. L. Snodgrass for ~~\$4.75~~ ^{for} sharpening lawn mowers having been approved by the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty, it was moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the said bill be allowed and a warrant ordered drawn on the Park Fund for the amount.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bill allowed.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned until Thursday, June 25th, at 2 o'clock p. m.
