

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 25th, 1914.

Pursuant to adjournment, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened at 2 o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington presiding.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeek, Rankin, Helmburg. Absent: Commissioner Carsen.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

A communication from theatre owners in reference to the proposed building ordinance and asking that certain provisions thereof be changed, was received and read.

Bids for the construction of cement sidewalk and curb on the South side of Walnut Park were received and read, being as follows:

H. A. Pelker, bid \$337.50; Edward Johnson, bid \$320.00; Veils & Fix, bid \$333.00;
F. E. Welch, bid \$273.75.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the bid of F. E. Welch be accepted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned until to-morrow, June 26th, at 2 o'clock p. m.
