

Grand Junction, Colorado, June 30, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioners Rankin and Carsen.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 23d and adjourned sessions of June 25th and 26th were read and approved.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file.

A communication from W. F. Brown, Division General Manager of the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph Company, was read. On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the communication was referred to the Telephone Franchise committee.

L. F. Elliepules having made verbal application for employment agency license, it was moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the license be granted upon the payment of \$15.00 to the City Treasurer for six months and upon the filing of the necessary bond.

The motion carried, and it was ordered.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, ye a; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Appraisal and Valuation of the Electric Light, Power and Gas Plants now Operated under Franchises from the City of Grand Junction," was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the proof of publication was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried, and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Appraisal and Valuation of the Electric Light, Power and Gas Plants now Operated under Franchises from the City of Grand Junction," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:
Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 226.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Theatres and Moving Picture Shows," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, that the proposed ordinance be passed for publication.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

Moved by Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that The Daily Sentinel continue as the official newspaper of the City to and including July 1, 1914, and that the Daily News be designated as the official newspaper from July 2, 1914, to and including December 31st, 1914.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and it was so ordered.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council adjourned.
