

Grand Junction, Colorado, July 7, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeek, Rankin, Carsen, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of June 30th were read and approved.

The report of C. H. Branscombe, structural engineer, on an examination of the structural features of the Park Opera House building, was received and read.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly report of the City Treasurer was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the report was referred to the Auditor.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the gas plant owned by the Grand Junction Electric, Gas and Manufacturing Company, located on Block Four in Milldale Subdivision, City of Grand Junction, has no sewer connection and the owner of said plant desires to secure connection with the public sewers; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the owner of said real estate is hereby authorized to make one connection to the public sewer running in the alley located just south of South Avenue on the following terms and conditions:

(a) Said owner shall first pay to the City of Grand Junction the sum of Seventy-two Dollars.

(b) The pipe running to said sewer shall not exceed two inches in diameter.

(c) A man-hole shall be constructed by the said company at or near the point of entrance of the said connection into the sewer at least two feet in diameter, the exact location to be determined by the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

(d) No liquid or substance shall be permitted to flow into the public sewer through said connection that is unusually injurious to the sewer or tends to clog the same. Should any such liquid or substance be permitted to enter said public sewer to the damage of said sewer, the said Council may cause the sewer to be disconnected from said property.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Council make an appropriation of \$12.50 per month for the remainder of the current year, for the payment of rental of a public rest room; provided, that an appropriation of a like amount be made by the County of Mesa.

The motion being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carsen, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the Council adjourned until Monday, July 13, at 4 o'clock p. m.
