

Grand Junction, Colorado, July 14, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeek, Carsen, Helmburg. Absent: Commissioner Rankin.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 7th and adjourned session of July 13th were read and approved.

The quarterly report of the Judge of the Municipal Court was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, the same was referred to the auditor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs was submitted and read. The report was, on motion of Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, referred to the auditor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, the report was referred to the auditor.

The quarterly report of the City Clerk and Auditor was submitted and read, and the same was, on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The quarterly report of the City Health Officer was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeek, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.



The quarterly report of the Chief of the Fire Department was submitted and read, and the same having been approved by the Mayor it was, on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was, on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

The proof of publication of a proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Theatres and Moving Picture Shows," was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the same was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the proposed ordinance be taken up for final passage.

The motion carried and the proposed ordinance was then read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the proposed ordinance as read and entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Theatres and Moving Picture Shows," be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the ordinance passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the ordinance just passed be numbered 227.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

Commissioner Rankin now reported present.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the Commissioner of Highways be authorized and instructed to construct a stereosem between the City Hall and City Barn, the cost of same to be equally divided between the Highways and General Funds.



The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:  
Cherrington, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Carsen, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Carsen, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the Council  
adjourn.

The motion carried, and the Council then adjourned.
