

Grand Junction, Colorado, July 25, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Commissioner Carsen, Acting Mayor, in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Carsen, Verbeek, Rankin, Helmburg. Absent: Commissioner Cherrington.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 21 and adjourned session of July 22 were read and approved.

The bill of the Mt. States Telephone and Telegraph Co. for \$18.35[✓] for telephone service for the month of July having been approved by the Commissioner of Water and Sewers, it was moved by Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the bill be allowed and warrants ordered drawn on the General, Water and Fire Funds for the amount. ^{(#17,701) (#17,702) (#17,703)}

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Carsen, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried and the bill allowed.

On the petition of A. M. Schmidt and others asking that the ordinance in reference to the appraisal and valuation of the electric light and gas plants now operated under franchises, the City Attorney and Clerk reported that said petition contained more than the requisite number of signers.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the petition was ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the Council reconsider the action taken at its meeting held June 30, 1914, in passing an ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Appraisal and Valuation of the Electric Light, Power and Gas Plants now Operated under Franchises from the City of Grand Junction."

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Carsen, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that further action on the ordinance now before the Council and entitled, "An Ordinance Concerning the Appraisal and Valuation of the Electric Light, Power and Gas Plants now Operated under Franchises from the City of Grand Junction," be deferred until the next regular meeting of the Council.

The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners present.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeek, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
