

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 4, 1914.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of July 28th were read and approved.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was on motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows:

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Relating to Water Rents," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows:  
Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

A proposed ordinance, entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Municipal Elections," was introduced and read.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the proposed ordinance as read be passed for publication.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows:  
Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

The following resolution was introduced and read:

#### RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the Canning Factory located on tract of land in the NW 1-4 NE 1-4 Sec. 23, Tp. 1S., R. 1 W., Ute Mer., described as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point in the north line of the right of way of the Rio Grande Junction Railway 50 feet north of the center of the track and where the same crosses the east line of Seventh street in the city of Grand Junction, from thence north 250 feet, thence east 140 feet, thence south 205 feet to the said right of way of the Rio Grande Junction Railway, thence southwesterly along said right of way to place of beginning, has no sewer connection, and the owner of said real estate desires to connect with the public sewers; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the owner of said real estate is hereby authorized to make one connection to the sewer on Seventh street on the following terms: (a.) Said owner shall pay to the City of Grand Junction, Seventy-two dollars; (b.) the pipe line to said sewer from said real estate shall not exceed 4 inches in diameter; (c.) no liquid or substance shall be permitted to flow into the public sewer from said connection that shall tend to clog or injure the said sewer. Should any such liquid or substance be permitted to enter said public sewer to the damage of the said sewer, the City Council may cause the sewer to be disconnected from said property.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:  
Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the Mayor and Clerk be authorized and instructed to issue certificates of construction to S. R. Veils and P. A. Fix for the amount of \$52.87, being the cost of sidewalk fronting Lots 21 and 22, Block 29, City of Grand Junction, the owner having failed to construct said sidewalk according to ordinance.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and it was so ordered.

Under the order of "Unfinished Business," the Council took up for reconsideration Ordinance No. 226, an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Concerning the Appraisal and Valuation of the Electric Light, Power and Gas Plants now operated under Franchises from the City of Grand Junction."

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the ordinance be referred to the people for their adoption or rejection, at a special election, to be held September 29, 1914.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried, and it was so ordered.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Commissioner of Water and Sewers and the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, together with the City Attorney, be appointed a special committee to prepare an ordinance in relation to water rentals.

The motion carried.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the Council adjourn.

The motion carried, and the Council then adjourned.
