RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the Canning Factory located on tract of land in the NW 1-4
NE 1-4 Sec. 23, Tp. 18., R. 1 W., Ute Mer., described as follows, to-wit:
Beginning at a point in the north line of the right of way of the Rio Grande
Junction Railway 50 feet north of the center of the track and where the
same crosses the east line of Seventh street in the city of Grand
Junction, from thence north 250 feet, thence east 140 feet, thence south
205 feet to the said right of way of the Rio Grande Junction Railway,
thence southwesterly along said right of way to place of beginning, has no
sewer connection, and the owner of said real estate desires to connect with

Said owner shall pay to the City of Grand Junction, Seventy-two dellars; (b.) the pipe line to said sewer from said real estate shall not exceed 4 inches in diameter; (c.) no liquid or substance shall be permitted to flow into the public sewer from said connection that shall tend to clog or injure the said sewer. Should any such liquid or substance be permitted to enter said public sewer to the damage of the said sewer, the City Council may cause the sewer to be disconnected from said property.
