

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 11, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall; with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Verbeck.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 4 were read and approved.

Ben Griffith, representing the expressmen of the city, appeared before the Council and presented the petition of C. B. Rich and others, asking the Council not to pass that certain section of a proposed traffic ordinance relating to expressmen.

The petition was received and filed.

A communication from Griffith, Watson & Smith, attorney for C. W. Sheres, in reference to sale of Fair Grounds tract to the City and offering said tract for the sum of \$22,000.00, provided said sum is paid on or before December 1, 1914, was presented and read; also a communication from H. T. Henderson, a civil engineer, offering his services to the City to make an estimate of the value of the Grand Junction electric light plant.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the communications were ordered placed on file.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the Council adjourned until Thursday, August 13th, at 4 o'clock p. m.
