

Grand Junction, Colorado, August 25, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeek, Rankin, Carson, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 15th were read and approved.

The petition of H. and A. Burnett and others, asking the Council to pass an ordinance licensing solicitors for hotels and rooming houses, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the petition was referred to the City Attorney.

Commissioner Verbeek of the special committee appointed to secure a provisional option on the purchase of the Fair Grounds, reported that Mr. Sheres had refused to make any reduction in his former price of \$22,000 for the property.

The report was received but no action was taken by the Council in the matter.

The labor account of the Department of Health and Civic Beauty for \$229.00, (#17,543-553) for labor and team work, cleaning alleys and hauling away trash, having been approved by the Commissioner and audited, it was moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the same be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the amount.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeek, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the labor account allowed.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the Council adjourned.
