

Grand Junction, Colorado, September 1, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carsen, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 25th were read and approved.

The petition of P. C. Watson, J. A. Measures and others, asking the Council to submit to a vote of the qualified electors of the city at a special election a proposition to amend Section 72 of the Charter of the City of Grand Junction, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, that the petition be placed on file and referred to the City Attorney and Clerk for verification.

The motion carried and it was so ordered.

The petition of Elmer E Frank, J. A. Measures and others, asking the Council to submit to a vote of the qualified electors of the city at a special election a proposition to amend Section 96 of the Charter of the City of Grand Junction, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Carsen, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the petition was ordered placed on file and referred to the City Attorney and Clerk for verification.

The petition of Edw. R. Heflin, O. L. Watson, S. O. Burket and others, asking the Council to submit to the qualified electors of the city at a special election a proposition to amend the last paragraph of Section 35, Article IV, of the Charter of the City of Grand Junction, together with an alternative proposition amending said section of the Charter, was presented and read.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the petition be placed on file and referred to the City Attorney and Clerk for verification.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, no; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carsen, no; Helmburg, yea.

A majority of the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and it was so ordered.

A communication from the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies submitting a list of delinquent water accounts, was presented and read. *The delinquent list comprised 2 meter accounts; one, 7 quarters delinquent; 9, 3 quarters delinquent, and 33, Two quarters delinquent.*

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, the communication was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

A communication from the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, submitting a list of licensed occupations for which licenses expired July 1st and have not been renewed, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, the communication was referred to the Mayor.

A communication from Frank B. Johnson and others, protesting against the petition of H. and A. Burnett and others presented to the Council August 25th (asking the Council to license hotel and rooming house solicitors), and asking the Council to refuse to consider the said petition, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carson, the communication was referred to the City Attorney.

The monthly report of the City Weigher was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the same was referred to the Mayor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, the same was on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, accepted and ordered placed on file.

The quarterly report of the City Clerk and Auditor having been examined and approved by the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies, on motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the report was accepted and ordered placed on file.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies be authorized and instructed to purchase for the Highways department one minimum car Standard Asphalt Binder "O", at 12 1-4 cents per gal. f. o. b. Grand Junction.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carsen, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried.

On motion of Commissioner Carsen, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the Council adjourned.
