

Grand Junction, Colorado, September 25, 1914.

Pursuant to adjournment, the City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayor Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present; Cherrington, Verbeek, Rankin, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Carson.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeek, that the pool and billiard license issued to J. Caruse be transferred to his successor in the business, Louis Mendicelli. The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

The following bills having been approved by the Commissioner of Public Affairs and audited, were read by the Clerk:

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the bills as read be allowed and warrants ordered drawn for the several amounts.

The motion being put, upon call of roll the Commissioners voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the bills allowed.

Messrs. Wheatley & Reek having made application for permission to erect a brick chimney on the north wall of the building used by the Superba Theatre, there being no room to install a chimney inside, the following resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, the Superba Theatre, located on Lot 23, Block 103, in the City of Grand Junction, desires to put in a steam heating plant, and

WHEREAS, the said building has no chimney sufficiently large for such heating plant and the only available place for a chimney is at the rear of said building where the said building extends about twelve inches from the alley, if the said chimney is so constructed at the rear of said building it will extend into the alley about 15 inches; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the petition of Wheatley and Reek be granted, and they are hereby authorized to extend their said chimney into the alley to a distance not to exceed 15 inches, the said chimney being 29 inches in width; and

RESOLVED, that this permit is granted under the terms of Section 127 of the Charter, and is revocable by the Council at its pleasure at any time.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, that the resolution as read be passed and adopted.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:

Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners present having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

Moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, that J. B. Mathews, at 628 Main street, be served with a notice to remove wooden awning and other obstructions in front of his place from the sidewalk.

The motion carried, and it was so ordered.

A communication from the Winston Brothers Company, contractors for the Highline canal, making application to connect with the city water main at the north end of the Seventh street line, and asking to use water from the city system during the winter months, was presented and read.

On motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the communication was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the following appointments for judges and clerks of election for the special municipal election to be held October 1st, 1914, in the several voting precincts of the city, be made by the Council:
