The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Cemmissioners having veted yea, the Mayer declared the metien carried and the bills allowed.

The fellowing resolution was introduced and read:

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, The Book Cliff Railroad Company is the owner of a right of way for its railroad tracks across the certain street within the city of Grand Junction, known as Crosby Avenue, which said right of way is described as follows:

A right of way twenty feet wide, the center of which begin at a point on the West line of Crosby Avenue from whence the intersection of the North line of Main Street with the East line of the right of way of the Denver and Rio Grande Railroad Company lies Southeast sixty-three feet; thence on a curve to the right North to a point on the East line of said Crosby Avenue whence the intersection of the North line of Main Street with the East line of said Crosby Avenue lies Southeast two hundred and seven feet; and,

WHEREAS, the said The Book Cliff Railroad Company has agreed to lower the grade of its said tracks where the same crosses said Crosby Avenue eighteen inches to conform to a grade about to be established by the city of Grand Junction at its own expense and without putting the city to the expense of passing an ordinance requiring it to lower its said grade if the city will remove all dirt which the said railroad company shall excavate from beneath its tracks and will furnish grade stakes necessary to advise the officers of said company in lowering said grade.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that said offer of The Book Cliff Railroad Company be accepted and that the City of Grand Junction do enter into a contract with the said company agreeing to remove said earth and to furnish said grade stakes, if the said railroad company will lower its said grade eighteen inches without having the same required by the passage of an ordinance.

Moved by Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that the resolution as introduced and read be passed and adopted.

The metien being put, each Commissioner, as his name was called, voted as fellows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Holmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted, and the City Attorney was instructed to prepare contract in accordance therewith.

On metion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the Council adjourned.
