

Grand Junction, Colorado, October 13, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of October 6th were read and approved.

Moved by Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the Mayor appoint a committee to investigate the matter of the employment of Messrs. Bullock & Walker as special attorneys for the City in the suit against the Denver & Rio Grande Railroad Company in reference to Lawrence avenue.

The motion carried, and the Mayor appointed as said committee, Commissioners Carson, Rankin and Verbeck.

H. E. Grubbs having made application to the Council for rebate on express license on account of having been out of business three months, it was moved by Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, that H. E. Grubbs be allowed a rebate of \$3.75 on his express license for the last half of the current year.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called, voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and it was so ordered.

The quarterly report of the City Clerk and Auditor was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Public Affairs was submitted and read. On motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the report was referred to the Auditor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Water and Sewers was submitted and read, and the same was, on motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carson, referred to the Auditor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Highways was submitted and read. The report was, on motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, referred to the Auditor.

The quarterly report of the Commissioner of Health and Civic Beauty was submitted and read, and on motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Helmburg, the same was referred to the Commissioner of Finance and Supplies.

The quarterly report of the Judge of the Municipal Court was submitted and read. The same was, on motion of Commissioner Verbeck, seconded by Commissioner Carson, referred to the Auditor.

The quarterly report of the Chief of the Fire Department was submitted and read.

On motion of Commissioner Carson, seconded by Commissioner Holmburg, the report was referred to the Mayor.

The quarterly report of the City Health Officer was submitted and read. The same was, on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Verbeck, accepted and ordered placed on file.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the motion was declared carried, and it was so ordered.
