

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 8, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Rankin, Carsen, Holmburg. Absent: Commissioner Verbeck.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of December 1st were read and approved.

The application of John A. Dixon for a master plumber's license was presented and read. On motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, the application was referred to the Commissioner of Water and Sewers.

The monthly report of the City Weigher having been examined and approved by the Mayor, the same was on motion of Commissioner Holmburg, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, accepted and ordered placed on file.
