

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 15, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

Upon call of roll, the following Commissioners responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeek, Rankin, Carson, Holmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of December 8th were read and approved.

On the application of John A. Dixon for a master plumbers' license, Commissioner Carson reported favorably, and moved that the license be granted to Mr. Dixon, the motion being seconded by Commissioner Rankin. The motion carried by a unanimous vote of the Council, and the license was ordered issued.

the Mayor and City Clerk be, and hereby are, authorized and instructed to issue the warrants in payment of the December salaries of all city officers and employes on or about December 21, 1914.

The motion being put, upon call of roll, the Commissioners voted as follows:

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the resolution passed and adopted.

On motion of Commissioner Rankin, seconded by Commissioner Carsen, the Council adjourned.
