

Grand Junction, Colorado, December 29, 1914.

The City Council of the City of Grand Junction convened in regular session at four o'clock p. m., in the City Hall, with Mayer Cherrington in the chair.

The following Commissioners, upon call of roll, responded as present: Cherrington, Verbeck, Rankin, Carson, Helmburg.

City Attorney Tupper was present.

The minutes of the regular meeting of December 22d and adjourned session of December 23d were read and approved.

On the petition of W. F. Pitner and others, submitting a proposed ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Concerning Sunday Closing," the City Attorney and City Clerk, to whom the same had been referred, reported that the petition was in proper form and was signed by more than the requisite number of electors.

The proposed ordinance was then taken up for consideration by the Council and read by the Clerk.

Moved by Commissioner Helmburg, seconded by Commissioner Rankin, that the petition be granted and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.

The motion being put, each Commissioner as his name was called voted as follows: Cherrington, yea; Verbeck, yea; Rankin, yea; Carson, yea; Helmburg, yea.

All the Commissioners having voted yea, the Mayor declared the motion carried and the proposed ordinance passed for publication.
