Concerning Town Officers,

Be it ordained by the Board Trustees  
of the Town of Grand Junction,

Sec 1<sup>st</sup> That Each and Every  
Officer of the Town of Grand Junction  
whether Elected or appointed, shall before  
Entering upon the duties of his office  
take and subscribe an oath or affirm-  
ation that he will support the Constitution  
of the United States, and the Constitution

Sec 2<sup>nd</sup> That the Board of Trustees shall as soon as practicable, after their organization each year appoint a Town Marshall, who shall hold his office for the term of six months and until his successors shall be appointed and qualified unless sooner removed by the Board of Trustees.

Sec 3<sup>rd</sup> The Board of Trustees may appoint a Town Attorney, Police Magistrate, Watchman and Policemen and officers not herein provided for whenever it shall be deemed advisable or necessary to do so, and prescribe the powers, duties and compensation of such officers; and such appointees shall hold office for such term as the Board of Trustees shall determine.

Sec 4<sup>th</sup> The Town Treasurer and such other officers as the Board of Trustees may designate, before entering upon the duties of their respective offices, shall execute bonds to the Town with securities to be approved by the Board of Trustees in such sums as the Board of Trustees may direct and approve; conditioned that they will faithfully perform the duties of their respective offices, and that they will whenever required by the Board of Trustees pay over <sup>all</sup> moneys and
