An Ordinance

Providing for the Collection of Poll Tax

Be it ordered by the Board
of Trustees of the Town of Grand Junction

Sec 1st That every male resident of this
Town over the age of twenty one
years ^{and} under the age of fifty years
shall labor each year one day
upon the avenues, streets and alleys
of said Town, but any persons in
lieu thereof may pay to the Street
Commissioner a Tax of two dollars for
such days labor.

Sec 2nd The Street Commissioner shall between
the first day of April and the first
day of ~~September~~ in each year notify
all persons in this ^{town} incorporation subject
to said Tax to appear at such time
and place and with such tools as
he may designate to perform the
amount of work required in lieu
of said Tax. Provided that nothing
in this section shall prevent the

Street-Commissioner from calling out-
any of such persons to perform such
work at any time when he shall
consider such work needed.

Sec 3rd Any person failing to present him-
self for labor or failing to pay the
amount which is taken in lieu of
such labor within ten days after
demanded by the Street-Commissioner
shall be sued for the amount
in an action for debt, and no set-
off shall be allowed thereto.

Sec 4th The Street-Commissioner shall
report to the Board of Trustees when
required so to do, a list of all persons
in this Corporation subject to road
tax, the names of all persons who
have performed the labor in stead
thereof. amount of money collected
and paid out by him, from whom
received, to whom and what for.
Paid, the number of days he him-
self has been in actual service and
a list of the delinquents.
